

Logging in

Each individual member of the Ramblers must have **their own email address** and access to emails sent to that address. This email address becomes the member's unique **Username**

To access the Members Area each member must also have a **Password** to log in.

Each month, usually round about the 21st, when the latest **Rambler** newsletter becomes available members are notified by email. This email will contain a direct link to the [Members Area](#). Clicking on this link gives the following request to supply your Username and Password:

If you have not received or cannot find this monthly email you can also get here **at any time** by opening your browser [Microsoft Edge/Explorer, Chrome etc.] and typing <https://www.theramblers.ie/members-area/> into the address bar.

You can also open your browser and go to the Home page at www.theramblers.ie

and click on



and you will a slightly different version of the request.

If you fill in your Username and Password in correctly and click on **Log in** you will then find yourself in the **Members Area**

Problems

There are usually no problems with the Username which will be visible as you type it and can thus be easily edited at any stage.

With the Password however each character typed appears as a dot – this is for security reasons. Because you cannot see the characters there is the possibility of an error in typing. The password is case sensitive and upper/lower case versions of a letter e.g **A** and **a** are treated as different characters.

If your password is not entered correctly then you will get the following error message:
